ART 230 Architectural Photography

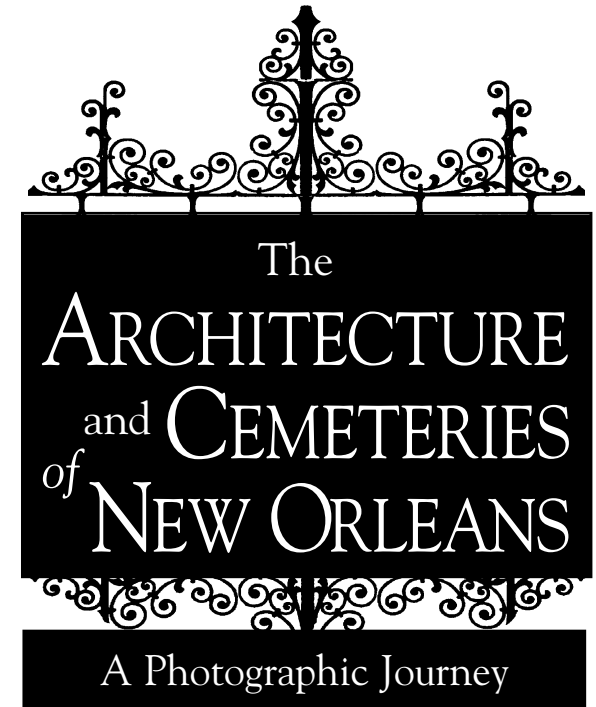
The French Quarter, Bourbon Street and St. Louis Cemetery are among the many historic locations that make New Orleans ideal for unique and varied photographic studies.

This course will give students the opportunity for extended photographic documentation. Students will take part in group meetings prior to departure. Field study group will then travel to New Orleans via Amtrak's famed *City of New Orleans* train and document multiple locations using their choice of conventional or digital photography. Upon their return to campus, students will produce a distinct body of work consisting of traditional or digital photographic prints.

Prerequisites: Consent of the instructor. ART 115 (Beginning Photography) or ART 117 (Digital Photography), or equivalent is recommended.

- ☞ To produce an extended photographic documentary project
- ☞ To broaden knowledge of black and white and color film and/or digital media
- ☞ To understand basic technical and aesthetic standards as applied to documentation
- ☞ To gain experience in location photography

INSTRUCTOR

Judy Langston, professor of art and graphic design at Oakton Community College, is a commercial photographer and nationally and internationally exhibiting gallery artist whose work is featured in museums and private collections all over the world. She has been recognized by and is an arts-in-education residency artist with the Illinois Arts Council. Ms. Langston is a graduate of the University of Illinois (M.A.) and the Institute of Design at the Illinois Institute of Technology (M.S., Photography).
